Oncology Clinic Nurse

We are registered nurses (RN) with specialized training and experience in cancer care.

The RN will keep track of any symptom issues, psychosocial concerns and treatment/cancer related side effects you have using the Putting Patients First form.

This form is completed for each clinic visit before you talk to the oncologist, only you can tell us how you are feeling.

Before Your Appointment

Bring Your Medications

- If anything has changed, let the Registered Nurse (RN) know.
- Make a list of any questions you want to ask the nurse and/ or oncologist.

During Your Appointment

We're Here for You

- The RN will be with you when you have your appointment with the oncologist.

Ask Questions

- The nurse and oncologist will explain everything and answer your questions.

Well-Being Check

- We will use the Putting Patient First Form to see how your symptoms are affecting you and to find ways to help you feel better and improve your quality of life.

After Your Appointment

- If you have questions, call the oncology clinic nurse.
- We can arrange virtual visits if you need them.
