Paid Family and Community Caregiver Pilot Project

What is the pilot?

A two-year pilot project to give extra supports to community members living in their home.

Who can apply for the pilot?

- Elders;
- Seniors; and
- Persons with Disabilities

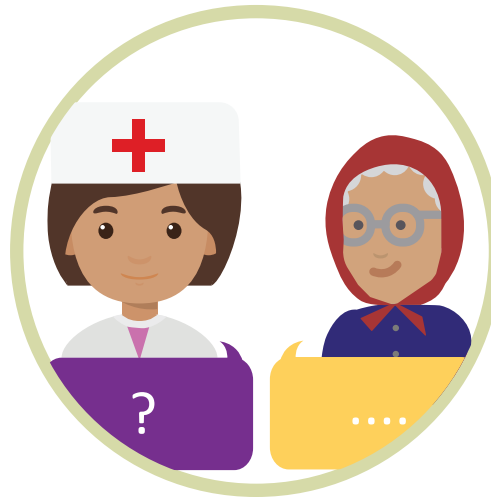
What is the purpose of the pilot?

- To give support to elders/seniors and persons with disabilities to help them live in their own home for as long as possible
- To increase the independence of elders/seniors and persons with disabilities and their families

The nurse at Home Care or the Health Centre will:

- Assess the care needs of the people who apply for the pilot
- Be part of a committee through NTHSSA that will chose who is accepted
- Check in throughout the pilot to make sure the participants needs are being met

NOT everyone that applies will be part of the pilot



The caregiver can be a:

- member of you family that becomes hired by the community organization
- OR**
- hired employee of the organization

You will have a choice



Community-Based Organizations will:

- Hire and support the Paid Caregivers to provide the best support services to the pilot participants
- Schedule and pay the caregiver
